SUBJECT: Financial Audit of the Bitter Yucca for Sweet Milk Project in Colombia, Managed by Cooperativa Colanta, Cooperative Agreement 72051419CA00006, January 1 to December 31, 2022 (I-514-24-012-R)

This memorandum transmits the final audit report on the Bitter Yucca for Sweet Milk Project in Colombia. Cooperativa Colanta contracted with the independent audit firm Baker Tilly Colombia LTDA to conduct the audit. The audit firm stated that it performed its audit in accordance with generally accepted government auditing standards. However, it did not have an external peer review that fully satisfies the standards' requirements. The audit firm is responsible for the enclosed report and the conclusions expressed in it. We do not express an opinion on Cooperativa Colanta's schedule of expenditures of USAID awards; the effectiveness of its internal control; or its compliance with the award, laws, and regulations.¹

The audit objectives were to (1) express an opinion on whether the schedule of expenditures of USAID awards for the period audited, was presented fairly, in all material respects; (2) evaluate Cooperativa Colanta's internal controls; and (3) determine whether Cooperativa Colanta complied with award terms and applicable laws and regulations. To answer the audit objectives, the audit firm reported that they assessed and tested the internal controls related to the project; assessed and tested compliance with applicable laws, regulations, the agreement's provisions; and reviewed project expenditures. The audit covered \$907,241 of USAID expenditures for the audited period.

The audit firm concluded the schedule of expenditures of USAID awards presented fairly, in all material respects, program revenues and costs incurred under the award for the period audited.

The audit firm did not identify any material weaknesses in internal control or instances of

material noncompliance with applicable laws, regulations, and agreement terms.

During our desk review, we noted one area for improvement which the audit firm should address in future audit reports. We presented this area in a memo to the controller, dated April 16, 2024.

Based on the results of the desk review, OIG is not making any recommendation to USAID/Colombia.

OIG does not routinely distribute independent public accounting reports beyond the immediate addressees because a high percentage of these reports contain information restricted from release under the Trade Secrets Act, 18 U.S.C. 1905 and Freedom of Information Act Exemption Four, 5 U.S.C. 552(b)(4) (“commercial or financial information obtained from a person that is privileged or confidential”). In addition, USAID OIG has determined that this transmittal memo and the enclosed report are not subject to notification and reporting requirements under Section 5274 of the National Defense Authorization Act.²
