SUBJECT: Closeout Audit of Costs Incurred by Volunteers for Economic Growth Alliance, Under the Assistance in Building Afghanistan by Developing Enterprises Program in Afghanistan, Cooperative Agreement AID-306-LA-13-00001, January 1, 2016, to July 15, 2018 (8-306-19-044-N)

This memorandum transmits the final report on the closeout audit of costs incurred by Volunteers for Economic Growth Alliance, under the Assistance in Building Afghanistan by Developing Enterprises program in Afghanistan, cooperative agreement AID-306-LA-13-00001, for the period from January 1, 2016, to July 15, 2018. The agency contracted with the independent certified public accounting firm Davis and Associates, PLLC to conduct the audit. The contract required the audit firm to perform the audit in accordance with generally accepted government auditing standards.

The audit firm states that it performed its audit in accordance with generally accepted government auditing standards. The audit firm is responsible for the enclosed report and the conclusions expressed in it. We do not express an opinion on the Volunteers for Economic Growth Alliance's schedule of costs incurred; the effectiveness of its internal control; or its compliance with the award, laws, and regulations.¹

The audit objectives were to: (1) express an opinion on whether the schedule of costs incurred for the period audited, was presented fairly, in all material respects; (2) evaluate the auditee's internal controls; (3) determine whether the auditee complied with award terms and applicable

laws and regulations; and (4) determine whether the auditee has taken corrective action on prior audit recommendations. To answer the audit objectives, the audit firm performed the subject audit that covered \$43,896,941 for the period from January 1, 2016, to July 15, 2018.

The auditors expressed an unmodified opinion on the schedule of costs incurred and did not identify any questioned costs. The auditors did not identify any significant deficiency or material weakness in internal control. The auditors also did not identify any instance of material noncompliance.

The report does not contain any recommendation for your action.

We appreciate the assistance extended to audit staff during the engagement.
