LA-H0-22-1977-G	Loss/Destruction of commodities		In September 2022, OIG received information from the USAID/Bureau of Humanitarian Assistance (BHA) that 33 hygiene kits were destroyed when Russian military forces shelled a distribution point in Mala Tokmachka Village, Ukraine. The estimated loss was \$1,815.
LA-H0-23-0014-G	Collusive Bidding	Closed	In October 2022, OIG received information from an implementer reporting vendor collusion in connection with the USAID-funded program Ukraine Democratic Governance East Activity. During the bid selection phase, the implementer realized that three companies were created by the same individual and presented similar bid proposals. The implementer refused the submissions and there was no loss to the government.
