**SUBJECT:** Financial Audit of USAID Resources Managed by Virunga Foundation in the Democratic Republic of the Congo Under Cooperative Agreement 72066019CA00001, July 22, 2019, to December 31, 2021 (Report No. 4-660-23-031-R)

This memorandum transmits the final audit report on USAID resources managed by Virunga Foundation under the Virunga Electricity Distribution Grid Project. Virunga Foundation contracted with the independent audit firm KPMG, Kigali, Rwanda to conduct the audit. The audit firm stated that it performed its audit in accordance with generally accepted government auditing standards. However, it did not have an external peer review or a continuing professional education program that fully satisfy the standards' requirements. The audit firm is responsible for the enclosed report and the conclusions expressed in it. We do not express an opinion on Virunga Foundation's schedule of expenditures of USAID awards; the effectiveness of its internal control; or its compliance with the award, laws, and regulations.<sup>1</sup>

The audit objectives were to (1) express an opinion on whether the schedule of expenditures of USAID awards for the period audited, was presented fairly, in all material respects; (2) evaluate Virunga Foundation's internal controls; (3) determine whether Virunga Foundation complied with award terms and applicable laws and regulations; (4) review the indirect cost rate; and (5) review the implementation status of the prior period recommendations.

To answer the audit objectives, KPMG (1) audited the schedule of expenditures of USAID awards including the budgeted amounts by category and major items and the revenues received from USAID for the period covered by the audit and the costs reported by Virunga Foundation as incurred from July 22, 2019, to December 31, 2021; (2) evaluated the control environment, the adequacy of the accounting systems, and control procedures that pertain to Virunga Foundation's ability to report financial data consistent with the assertions embodied in each account of the schedule of expenditures of USAID awards; (3) identified the award terms and

pertinent laws and regulations and determined which of those, if not observed, could have a direct and material effect on the schedule of expenditures of USAID awards; (4) determined that the review of the indirect cost rate was not applicable; and (5) reviewed the implementation status of the prior period recommendations. Virunga Foundation reported expenditures of \$1,534,045 in USAID funds during the audited period.

The audit firm concluded the schedule of expenditures of USAID awards presented fairly, in all material respects, program revenues and costs incurred under the award for the period audited. The audit firm identified \$12,224 in ineligible questioned costs; no material weaknesses in internal control; and three instances of material noncompliance. Since the questioned costs did not meet the OIG's established threshold of \$25,000 for making a recommendation, we are not making a recommendation. Nevertheless, we suggest that USAID/Democratic Republic of the Congo (DRC) determine the allowability of the \$12,224 in questioned costs and recover any amount determined to be unallowable. In addition, although we are not making a recommendation for significant deficiencies noted in the report, we suggest that USAID/DRC determine if the recipient addressed the issues noted. The audit firm also issued a management letter.

To address the issues identified in the report, we recommend that USAID/Democratic Republic to the Congo:

**Recommendation 1.** Verify that Virunga Foundation corrects the three instances of material noncompliance detailed on pages 27 to 29 of the audit report.

We ask that you provide your written notification of actions planned or taken to reach management decision.
