SUBJECT: Closeout Financial Audit of the Promoting Citizen Participation in the Electoral Process and Public Debate Project in El Salvador Managed by Fundación Dr. Guillermo Manuel Ungo, Cooperative Agreement AID-519-A-17-00004, January 1, 2023, to May 31, 2024 (1-519-25-009-R)

This memorandum transmits the final audit report on the Promoting Citizen Participation in the Electoral Process and Public Debate Project in El Salvador. Fundación Dr. Guillermo Manuel Ungo (FUNDAUNGO) contracted with the independent audit firm RSM El Salvador, Ltda. de C.V. to conduct the audit. The audit firm stated that it performed its audit in accordance with generally accepted government auditing standards. However, it did not have an external peer review that fully satisfies the standards' requirements. The audit firm is responsible for the enclosed report and the conclusions expressed in it. We do not express an opinion on FUNDAUNGO's schedule of expenditures of USAID awards; the effectiveness of its internal control; or its compliance with the award, laws, and regulations.¹

The audit objectives were to (1) express an opinion on whether the schedule of expenditures of USAID awards for the period audited, was presented fairly, in all material respects; (2) evaluate FUNDAUNGO's internal controls; (3) determine whether FUNDAUNGO complied with award terms and applicable laws and regulations; and (4) determine if FUNDAUNGO has taken adequate corrective action on prior audit recommendations. To answer the audit objectives, the audit firm reported that they assessed and tested the internal controls related to the project; assessed and tested compliance with applicable laws, regulations, the agreement's provisions; and reviewed project expenditures. The audit covered \$2,798,264 of USAID expenditures for the audited period.

¹ We reviewed the audit firm's report for conformity with professional reporting standards. Our desk reviews are typically performed to identify any items needing clarification or issues requiring management attention. Desk reviews are limited to review of the audit report itself and excludes review of the auditor's supporting working papers; they are not designed to enable us to directly evaluate the quality of the audit performed.

The audit firm concluded the schedule of expenditures of USAID awards presented fairly, in all material respects, program revenues and costs incurred under the award for the period audited.

The audit firm did not identify any material weaknesses in internal control or instances of material noncompliance with applicable laws, regulations, and agreement terms. The audit firm issued a management letter which included minor internal control deficiencies.

The audit firm determined that the recipient has taken adequate corrective actions on prior audit report recommendations.

Additionally, in note six to the schedule of expenditures of USAID awards, the auditors reported an outstanding fund balance of \$6,545 as of the end of the audit period, but they did not state if this balance had been refunded to USAID. We are not making a formal recommendation on this issue; however, we bring this to the Agreement Officer's attention to verify that the recipient addressed the issue noted as part of the closeout process.

During our desk review, we noted several areas for improvement which the audit firm should address in future audit reports. We presented these areas in a memo to the controller, dated November 15, 2024.

Based on the results of the desk review, OIG is not making any recommendation to USAID/EI Salvador.

OIG does not routinely distribute independent public accounting reports beyond the immediate addressees because a high percentage of these reports contain information restricted from release under the Trade Secrets Act, 18 U.S.C. 1905 and Freedom of Information Act Exemption Four, 5 U.S.C. 552(b)(4) ("commercial or financial information obtained from a person that is privileged or confidential"). In addition, USAID OIG has determined that this transmittal memo and the enclosed report are not subject to notification and reporting requirements under Section 5274 of the National Defense Authorization Act.²
